Dear Atty. Green,

When we spoke on the telephone on May 11 and 24, 2005, you assured me that you would give my complaint against Wellesley College "a careful read," and would arrive at a decision "within a month" (please see attached notes on our conversations). That did not happen. Instead, on June 14, 2005, I received a fax from Dean Andrew Shennan proposing a negotiated resolution of my conflict with the College. As you know from my Amended Charges of August 16, 2005, I offered such a resolution through Wellesley Vice-President Pat Byrne as negotiator. As you also know from my letter to you of September 25, 2005, Wellesley declined my offer and refused to propose an alternative. Since then Wellesley has both cut off my health insurance and charged me for its premiums.

You already have full documentation of the damage to my health and wellbeing that Wellesley's hostile environment caused from 1990 to 2005. I left the United States in August 2005 because it was endangering my life, and because I concluded that I do not enjoy the legal protection to which a citizen of the United States is constitutionally entitled. I write to inform you that I do not intend to resume residency in the United States under these conditions. Should these conditions not change for the better in my lifetime, I will spend the remainder of it here in Europe.

Today is my 58th birthday. I am celebrating it among friends who wish me well.
