

## The Probable Trust Registry

(2015; Venice Biennale installation + Participatory Group Performance)

## THE RULES OF THE GAME #3 PERFORMANCE INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Each Signatory signs and dates the Personal Declaration at the Receptionist's desk iPad. The Receptionist prints out a hard copy for the Signatory.
- 2. The Signatory then lists his/her mailing address in the digital Registry document at the Receptionist's desk.
- 3. The contents of the digital Registry document are CONFIDENTIAL to the Gallery. The Receptionist is not to reveal this information to anyone, except by the Signatory's explicit permission.
  - 4. The Signatory retains the signed hard copy printout of the Personal Declaration.
- 5. The Receptionist retains the signed Personal Declaration digital iPad document on APRA's behalf.
- 6. The Receptionist files the copy alphabetically by last name in the *Rules of the Game* #3 folder.
- 7. Following the close of the exhibition, the Gallery sends *The Probable Trust Registry* #3, consisting in all Personal Declarations filed in *The Rules of the Game* #3, to all and ONLY its Signatories.
- 8. Should one Signatory wish to contact another, the Contactor must contact the Gallery to request the Contactee's contact information.
- 9. The Gallery must obtain the Contactee's explicit written permission to release her/his contact information to the Contactor. Otherwise permission is automatically denied.
- 10. Using an insured professional courier, the Gallery delivers the signed original Personal Declarations, alphabetically ordered to APRA within a month following the close of the exhibition.
- 11. These documents become part of the APRA Foundation Berlin confidential inventory and are sealed to the public for 100 years following the closing date of the exhibition.
- 12. The Receptionist, the Gallery, and the APRA Foundation Berlin have all signed Custodial Contracts agreeing to be bound by these Instructions.
